- As you will have probably noticed, The White Lion is finally roaring again, and is no longer a village eyesore. We wish them all the best, and hope that they continue to be available to the community for many years to come.
- Many thanks for those who help to keep the village looking beautiful and welcoming; those who care for the green, fill the village planters, keep the village tidy by picking up litter.
- A special mention to James Shenton, who made sure that his team kept the green tidy during the building work at The White Lion, and who arranged for the replacement bench in the bus shelter following the vandalism that occurred last autumn.

• Finally, on a more general note, many thanks to all the people who kept the community spirit going in whatever way. We hope that people will support village events now that they have restarted following the various lockdowns so that the people of Hankelow will get to know each other, and so that Hankelow will continue to have a real community spirit.

## 5. REPORT OF LOCAL COMMUNITY GROUPS

### Hankelow Amenities Group

After Covid restrictions were relaxed the Group provided refreshments for the Festival of Transport on 25 July 2021. A busy morning, lots of smiles and people really appreciated the Group being there providing tea, coffee and bacon baps.

The first Amenities meeting since Covid restrictions was on 24 November.

Carols on the Green went ahead on 13 December. Saxophonie accompanied the singing and two marquees helped to shelter the large amount of people who attended. The mulled wine and mince pies were enjoyed by all. A collection was taken and £267 was donated to the Nantwich Food Bank.

Main events were Crewe concert band, Cheshire Academy Gymnasts and Stapeley Broad Lane School Choir. The charities supported this year were St Luke's Hospice and Cheshire Young Carers.

They were hoping to attract more people to show what they do and to get more help with the fete and future events.
